## 1. Preliminary

---

- 1.1 These Rules may be cited as the ACTTAB Keno Rules.
- 1.2 These Rules are made under the *Lotteries Act 1964* and the *Pool Betting Act 1964*.
- 1.3 These Rules should be read in conjunction with the South Australian Lotteries Commission (SALC) Lotteries (General) Rules and Lotteries (Keno) Rules as amended. If there is any inconsistency between SALC Rules and the ACTTAB Rules, then:
  - (a) if the inconsistency relates to a person's eligibility for a prize, SALC's Rules prevail to the extent of the inconsistency; or
  - (b) otherwise, the ACTTAB Keno Rules will prevail.

## 2. Definitions

---

- 2.1 In these Rules unless the contrary intention appears:

"ACTTAB" means ACTTAB Limited ABN 98 071 257 504

"All Up Entry" means a Keno Coin Toss entry placed on a nominated number of consecutive draws, from 2 to 5 inclusive. In the event of a win in a draw, the prize is automatically reinvested in the following draw.

"Agent" or "Authorised Agent" means a party authorised by ACTTAB pursuant to the Betting Act to sell tickets in draws of the game offered for sale by the ACTTAB to the public and where ACTTAB sells a ticket it shall be an Agent for the purposes of these Rules in determining its relationship to the customer.

"Betting Account" means a facility that allows a customer to establish a credit balance to be used for betting purposes and the crediting of winnings and also allows deposits and withdrawals.

"Betting Act" means the Betting (ACTTAB Limited) Act 1964.

"card" means either a Keno Single/Coin Toss card or a Keno Coin Toss card for entry to the game.

"claim period" means the period commencing immediately after the draw ("relevant day") and ending at the close of business on the 14<sup>th</sup> day thereafter. If the 14<sup>th</sup> day is a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday the claim period will end at ACTTAB's close of business on the immediately preceding working day.

"Customer" means, with respect to a draw, a person who purchases and receives an entry ticket.

"draw" means a set of 20 winning numbers drawn by SALC's central computer from the numbers 1 to 80 on which Keno prizes are determined.

"entry fee" means the cost of a ticket as determined in accordance with these Rules.

"entry ticket" or "ticket" means a ticket printed by a computer terminal owned by ACTTAB after a card has been presented for processing by a computer terminal and shall contain the following information:

1. Participating draw number (or range of draw numbers).
2. Game type (Single or Combination).
3. Forecast or number selection.
4. Terminal number.
5. Serial number
6. Cost of entry.
7. Prize validation bar code.
8. Dollar value per game.
9. The day of purchase.
10. Information messages:
  - (a) Easi-Pick; or
  - (b) Other messages included at the discretion of ACTTAB.

"Evens" means, in the case of Keno Coin Toss, the selection or outcome where an equal proportion of the 20 drawn Keno numbers falls in each range (1-40 and 41-80) on the Keno game grid.

"game grid" means a grid of numbers from 1 to 80 inclusive distributed into 10 equal columns of 8 numbers and 8 equal rows of 10 numbers.

"game" or "games" means a set or sets of selected numbers chosen by the customer in a draw or draws respectively.

"game panel" means the combination of the "Spot" and "Selection" panels.

"guaranteed amount" means the prizes payable as designated in Schedule 1, subject to Rules 10.3, 10.4 and 11.

"Head Office" means the principal place of business of ACTTAB in the Territory.

"Heads" means, in the case of Keno Coin Toss, the forecast or outcome where 11 or more of the 20 drawn Keno numbers fall in the range 1-40 on the Keno game grid.

"Internet Betting Confirmation Screen" means the screen seeking confirmation from the customer that the details that the customer has entered are correct.

"Internet Betting Receipt" means the acknowledgement, including the reference number from ACTTAB via ACTTAB's internet site that acknowledges that an internet investment has been placed by a customer.

"Internet Investments" means all investments made using a Betting Account via an internet site operated by ACTTAB.

"Investment" means a wager placed by a customer with ACTTAB.

"Keno" means a lottery drawn at such intervals as determined by SALC in which the player is required to select between 1 and 10 numbers out of 20 numbers drawn from the range of numbers 1 to 80 inclusive;

“Keno Coin Toss” means an adjunct to the game of Keno where the player is required to predict the distribution of the 20 numbers drawn between predetermined segments of the Keno game grid.

“Keno Coin Toss card” means an entry card for Keno Coin Toss issued by ACTTAB and consisting of a Keno Coin Toss game panel.

“permitted multiple” means such number as ACTTAB and SALC determines. ACTTAB and SALC will agree on the permitted multiple.

SALC” means South Australian Lotteries Commission.

"selection panel" means a panel on a card where the customer marks his or her selections.

"selling point" means the Branches and Agencies of ACTTAB or the authorised Sub-Agencies of ACTTAB at which entry fees payable for entry of a card may be received or paid.

"single card" means an entry form for Keno issued by ACTTAB and consisting of a single game panel.

"Spot number" means the quantity of numbers to be selected and played.

"Spot numbers panel" means the designated panel on a coupon or electronic request for entry in which the Spot number is required to be marked to correspond with the numbers selected.

“Standard entry” means a Keno Coin Toss wager placed on a nominated number of independent draws. *(For definition of Allup Entry see Page 1).*

“Tails” means, in the case of Keno Coin Toss, the forecast or outcome where 11 or more of the 20 drawn Keno numbers fall in the range 41-80 on the Keno game grid.

2.2 Where these Rules limit or exclude liability on the part of ACTTAB, they are taken also to limit or exclude liability on the part of any Agent or Authorised Agent in the same way.

2.3 "including" and "includes" do not limit the generality of the subject matter which precedes them or to which they refer.

### 3. General

---

- 3.1 ACTTAB may from time to time amend these Rules in consultation with the SALC.
- 3.2 These Rules shall be available for inspection at all selling points and may be made public by any other means as directed by ACTTAB.

### 4. Liability

---

- 4.1 All decisions made by ACTTAB or SALC concerning Keno including the eligibility of entries, the determination of prize winners, the amount and distribution of prize money and the meaning and effect of these Rules, shall be final and binding on all customers and on every person making a claim in respect thereto.
- 4.2 It shall be a condition of entry in any draw that:
  - (a) neither the ACTTAB nor SALC shall be liable beyond the cost of a ticket in a draw in respect of any representation made by any employee of ACTTAB or SALC or anybody on behalf of ACTTAB or SALC;
  - (b) the customer shall accept all risks, losses, delays, errors or omissions which may occur in the course of delivery of applications for tickets to ACTTAB by an Agent or by whatever other means the same may be effected;
  - (c) neither ACTTAB nor SALC shall be liable for loss or damage arising out of the unlawful acts of any servant or agent of ACTTAB or SALC or a third party including SALC or for fire, flood, tempest, storm, riot, civil commotion, lock-outs or strikes or equipment failure in respect of which a claim is made and in any such case a customer shall be entitled only to a refund of the entry fee paid by the customer in respect of the ticket on which the customer is claiming a prize in full and final settlement of any claim;
  - (d) neither ACTTAB nor SALC shall be responsible for any act, neglect, omission, delay or failure of ACTTAB or SALC or any Agent or any servant, agent or employee including:
    - (i) to forward any entry in any draw to ACTTAB or SALC; or
    - (ii) to properly validate or process or to properly enter the same in any particular draw; or
    - (iii) for assistance given in completing a card or to properly or accurately process a verbal request by a customer to participate in a draw; or
    - (iv) for cancellation of a customer's ticket in error.

ACTTAB or SALC or any Agent or any servant, agent or employee may plead this Rule as a bar to any legal proceedings against it by any customer alleging breach, default or non-performance of any contract or duty by ACTTAB or SALC or the Agent or any servant, agent or employee. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing neither ACTTAB nor SALC will be responsible where an Agent has altered a card in any way without the authority of the customer;

- (e) Customers acknowledge that system limitations govern ACTTAB's ability to correct errors in entries. The taking of the entry ticket shall constitute an acknowledgement that the numbers thereon are the customer's selections, and if the customer does not notify the operator of the selling point terminal of any error in sufficient time to allow the selections to be changed prior to 40 seconds before the first draw in which the ticket is entered, the customer shall be deemed to have acknowledged that the numbers on the entry ticket are the customer's selections and no card or oral evidence shall thereafter have validity for any of the draws entered;
- (f) the customer shall ensure that the card submitted is correctly completed in accordance with these Rules and the customer acknowledges that neither ACTTAB nor SALC nor any Authorised Agent has responsibility to check the card when accepting the same;
- (g) when a computer terminal fails to read a card and operator intervention is required to correctly process the card neither ACTTAB, SALC or the Authorised Agent shall be responsible where an operator incorrectly keys into the computer terminal from verbal selections by the customer a number or numbers not selected by the customer;
- (h) neither ACTTAB or SALC is liable for any loss or damage suffered by a customer or any other person as a result of a failure of or malfunction in any equipment operated by ACTTAB or SALC, or by an Authorised Agent or by any other person on behalf of ACTTAB or SALC.

4.3 Notwithstanding the provisions of any other clause of these Rules, in the event that particulars on a ticket evidencing entry to a draw differ from SALC's central computer record of that entry, SALC's central computer record of the entry shall be the sole determinant in identifying what prize, if any, is payable in respect of that entry.

4.4 An entry ticket which has been recorded as void on the magnetic tape or other storage system of SALC's central computer shall be void and of no validity in claiming a prize and the customer shall have no claim against ACTTAB or SALC (whether such void recording is at the request of the customer, a malfunction of the computer system or by reason of operator error or otherwise). An entry ticket incorrectly recorded on the magnetic tape or other storage system of

SALC's central computer shall be deemed void. SALC shall determine if an entry ticket has been correctly recorded.

- 4.5 Any ticket may be judged void by ACTTAB or SALC if it is stolen, illegible, mutilated, altered, misprinted, incomplete, defaced or defective in any other manner.
- 4.6 Liability for void tickets (if any) is limited to replacement of the tickets at the discretion of ACTTAB.
- 4.7 Where a ticket has been issued by ACTTAB which ACTTAB or SALC determines is defective then if such defect is discovered in sufficient time prior to determination of the first draw for which that ticket is entered (in accordance with Rule 4(2)(e)) then ACTTAB may cancel such defective ticket and at its discretion either:
  - (a) replace such ticket with another ticket; or
  - (b) refund to the customer or bearer of the ticket the entry fee paid for such defective ticket.
- 4.8 A ticket once purchased by a customer will not be repurchased by ACTTAB or SALC nor changed by ACTTAB or SALC otherwise than in accordance with these Rules.
- 4.9 Where these Rules provide that ACTTAB, SALC or any Agent has no liability, or their liability is limited, their servants, agents and employees' liability is similarly excluded or limited.

## 5. Objectives and Participation

---

- 5.1 These Rules shall apply to the conduct of Keno and shall be binding on all customers. By submitting a card, the customer agrees to be bound by these Rules.
- 5.2 Each draw conducted shall be identified by a number and a date.
- 5.3 Every customer entering a draw shall submit only the card or cards provided for that purpose from time to time by ACTTAB and ACTTAB or Agent may reject an entry made on any other form.
- 5.4 An entry ticket will be issued upon entry into a draw.
- 5.5 Where an entry ticket upon issue is, in the opinion of the customer, illegible or defective in any manner, then subject to Rule 4(2)(e) the entry to which the issued entry ticket relates may be cancelled, but no duplicate ticket shall be provided by the computer terminal or by any other means whatsoever.
- 5.6 No manual alteration to an entry ticket shall be made or, if made, will not have any validity for any purpose.
- 5.7 The printing and issuing by a computer terminal of an entry ticket shall constitute an acknowledgement by ACTTAB and SALC of the acceptance of such

entry in the draw or draws referred to on the entry ticket and for the selections shown thereon.

- 5.8 The entry fee payable for participating in a draw where the customer selects a permitted multiple of "1", or where the customer does not select a permitted multiple, shall be an amount determined by SALC in consultation with ACTTAB.
- 5.9 A customer may choose to enter a game (set of selections) on a card more than once in the same draw by marking the appropriate box in the "Dollars per game" panel.
- 5.10 (a) A customer may select a permitted multiple by marking the "\$Value per Keno Game" or "\$Value per Coin Toss Game" panel on a card accordingly. Possible permitted multiples are 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 10, 20, 50 or 100. If a customer does not mark the "\$Value per Keno Game" or "\$Value per Coin Toss Game" panel so as to select a permitted multiple, the customer is taken to have selected a permitted multiple of "1".
- (b) The entry fee payable for each game shall be the permitted multiple selected by the customer multiplied by the entry fee determined under Rule 5.8.
- 5.11 The total cost of each card shall be paid before the card will be accepted by ACTTAB for entry into any draw and the amount paid shall correspond with the number of games and draws completed on the card.
- 5.12 Subject to Rule 5.13, there is no limit to the number of cards that can be played, save that in any one draw, ACTTAB or SALC may decline to issue more than one thousand entries to any one customer and a customer can be issued with entries costing no more than \$99,999.
- 5.13 (a) ACTTAB or SALC may determine that it will decline to accept any specified entry or class of entry.
- (b) A determination under paragraph (a) may be expressed to operate either generally or in circumstances specified in the determination.
- 5.14 Subject to Rule 5.12, a customer must nominate the amount to be spent on each game by marking the appropriate amount in the "\$Value per Keno game" panel or the "\$Value per Keno Coin Toss" panel.

## 6. Number of Draws

---

- 6.1 A customer may choose to enter the number selections on a card for a series of consecutive draws by marking the appropriate box in the "Number of Draws" panel. The number of consecutive draws that may be entered in this way is up to 100 draws or such other number as the ACTTAB determines.
- 6.2 The total amount received by ACTTAB shall govern the number of consecutive draws with the same game (set of selections) required by the customer.
- 6.3 The Rules governing single draw entries shall apply to every consecutive draw entry.

## 7. Entries

---

- 7.1 ACTTAB or any Authorised Agent may refuse to accept, or reject after acceptance, any card which has not been duly completed in accordance with these Rules or which is not accompanied by the applicable entry fee.
- 7.2 Payment for tickets will be in money of legal tender unless ACTTAB otherwise determines (eg. ACTTAB Gift Voucher) and will accompany a card for entry to a draw or draws.
- 7.3 A request to enter a draw shall be deemed to be a request to enter such draw subject to these Rules and the customer will be bound by these Rules and ACTTAB will issue a ticket on the basis that the customer is bound by these Rules.
- 7.4 To create a Keno entry a customer must forecast or cause to be forecast between 1 and 10 numbers. The numbers forecast must not be duplicated.
- 7.5 To create a Keno Coin Toss entry a player must forecast or cause to be forecast the distribution of the 20 numbers drawn in the corresponding Keno draw between predetermined segments of the Keno game grid.
- 7.5.1 If a Standard entry is marked each draw in which a player participates is considered an individual entry.
- 7.5.2 If an All-up entry is marked the total number of draws within the All-up are considered an individual entry.
- 7.6 The quantity of numbers forecast by a player under Rule 7.4 is the Spot number and the customer must mark the Spot number panel or cause it to be marked accordingly, by marking the number equal to the quantity of numbers selected.
- 7.7 In the case of an entry card a customer's forecast must be marked by hand with a horizontal mark in the centre of the square using a pencil or a black or blue pen. All marks on an entry card must be legible.
- 7.8 The minimum number of games that must be completed will be one (1) or such number as otherwise determined by ACTTAB.
- 7.9 ACTTAB may determine that it will decline to accept any specified entry or type of entry. Such determination may be expressed to operate either generally or in circumstances specified in the determination.

## 8. EasiPick

---

- 8.1 A customer may play by means of EasiPick nomination at the selling point. ACTTAB or the Agent must enter the information nominated by the customer into the terminal and cause it to generate a forecast of the type nominated by the player.
- 8.2 A customer may obtain an EasiPick single entry by marking the "EasiPick" box and also marking any or all of the Spot, \$Value Per Keno Game and Number of Draws panels.
- 8.3 The EasiPick forecast shall be duly imprinted on an entry ticket issued by the computer terminal, and such selections imprinted shall be deemed to be those selections nominated to ACTTAB or authorised agent as if they were marked on a card by the hand of the customer in accordance with Rule 7.7.

## 9. Determination of Winning Numbers

---

- 9.1 Each draw will be identified by a date and a number.
- 9.2 In respect of each draw, the computer system operated by SALC shall cause 20 winning numbers to be selected from the numbers 1 to 80.

## 10. Prize Pool Allocation

---

- 10.1 Only one prize can be won by any one game (one selection of numbers) in a draw.
- 10.2 The prizes payable will be as designated in Schedule 1, subject to Rules 10.3, 10.4 and 11.
- 10.3 The prize for 10 hits in a Spot 10 entry:
- 10.3.1 if there is 1 winner, will be the amount designated in Schedule 1;
- 10.3.2 if there is more than 1 winner, will be apportioned between such winners in accordance with the following formula:

$$W = \frac{Ew}{Et} \times (Ga+J) \quad (\text{where } W \text{ is the amount payable to a particular winner; } Ew \text{ is the entry fee paid by the particular winner for the winning selection of numbers; } Et \text{ is the total of all entry fees paid by all winners in respect of winning selections of numbers.) } Ga \text{ is the guaranteed amount – see Rule 11.2. } J \text{ is the jackpot – see Rule 11.2.}$$

- 10.4 Other than the prize for 10 hits in a Spot 10 entry, if:
- 10.4.1 the total amount of the prizes in any draw exceeds \$500,000; and

10.4.2 a prize is equal to or greater than \$1,001 other than by reason of the fact that the permitted multiple of the entry was greater than 1, the prize will be reduced to an amount calculated in accordance with the following formula:

P =	$\frac{W \times \$500,000}{Wt}$	where	P	is the reduced prize;
			W	is the amount payable to a particular winner under Schedule 1; and
			Wt	is the total of all prizes payable to all winners under Schedule 1.

10.5 The prizes payable for Keno Coin Toss will be as designated in Schedule 2.

## 11. Keno Prize Reserve

---

11.1 From time to time, SALC may set aside and maintain such sums, including a proportion of the total amount received from Spot 10 entry fees to any draw, to constitute a pool called the Keno Prize Reserve.

11.2 The Keno Prize Reserve will be accumulated by SALC to constitute the guaranteed amount and the jackpot and be applied as follows:

11.2.1 the jackpot will be distributed from time to time as additional or increased prize money to Spot 10 winners together with the guaranteed amount in such draws and in such amounts as SALC determines.

11.2.2 If there is no Spot 10 winner in any draw in which the jackpot is offered, the jackpot will be added to the jackpot in the next draw in which the jackpot is offered and this jackpotting will continue until there is a Spot 10 winner.

## 12. Prize Structure

---

12.1 The prize structure in a draw will be in accordance with Schedule 1, Schedule 2 and Rule 10.

## 13. Payment of Prizes

---

13.1 ACTTAB's records as to payment of prizes in respect of a ticket shall be conclusive.

13.2 No prize shall bear interest as against ACTTAB or SALC.

13.3 The maximum prize paid in cash will be \$1,000 in accordance with the ACT *Gambling and Racing Control (Code of Practice) Regulation 2002*.

13.4 Any other prize will be paid as soon as practicable after the relevant draw.

- 13.5 The drawing of a cheque by ACTTAB will not be deemed payment until that cheque is presented for collection.
- 13.6 Prizes can be claimed at an ACTTAB terminal for up to four (4) weeks from the date of purchase. Beyond that period, prizes must be claimed at ACTTAB's Head Office within twelve (12) months of the date of purchase, as no prizes will be paid after that time.
- 13.7 Payment of lost, destroyed, inaccessible tickets or tickets beyond the terminal claim period:
- (a) Ticket claims falling into the above categories may be lodged at any ACTTAB outlet or Head Office.
  - (b) ACTTAB may at its sole discretion pay the claim by cheque to be forwarded by post to the claimant.
  - (c) A claim in respect of a lost or destroyed ticket will be paid if the person making the claim for the prize proves to the satisfaction of ACTTAB that:
    - the ticket has been lost or destroyed;
    - he or she is the person entitled to the prize; and
    - a prize has not already been paid in respect of the ticket; and
    - that person provides ACTTAB and SALC with an indemnity in terms required by ACTTAB and SALC against all claims, losses, costs and expenses arising out of or in any way connected with more than one prize being paid in respect of the ticket.
  - (d) A claim in respect of an inaccessible ticket will be paid if the person making the claim for the prize proves to the satisfaction of ACTTAB that he or she is the person entitled to the prize.
  - (e) ACTTAB may require the person making a claim to verify the claim in such manner as ACTTAB requires including by statutory declaration. The prize to which the claim relates will be paid at such time as ACTTAB determines.
- 13.8 A claim form incomplete in any details required by ACTTAB may be disregarded.
- 13.9 ACTTAB will keep the results of each draw of the game for a period of 12 months from the date of the draw and make the results available for perusal at any time during that period.
- 13.10 An entry ticket issued in respect of an entry which has been identified by the SALC's central computer as a prize-winning entry shall, when evaluated by a computer terminal and prize payment is made in respect thereof, be retained by ACTTAB or authorised agent.
- 13.11 Where a prize winning entry ticket is processed in accordance with these Rules and is acknowledged by SALC's central computer to contain subscriptions in any draw which has not yet been drawn or conducted, the operator at the selling point shall issue an exchange entry ticket to the bearer thereof and such exchange entry ticket shall contain the same selections and specify the remaining numbers of the draws in which it shall be entered.

13.12 No prize will be paid on presentation of a prize winning ticket if a prize has previously been paid in respect of that ticket under Rule 13.7.

## 14. Prize Claims

---

14.1 In the case of Spots 8, 9 and 10 prizes:

14.1.1 prize money will be distributed after the claim period has elapsed

14.1.2 claims lodged within the claim period and determined by the central computer system to be a prize winning ticket and any tickets subsequently identified within the claim period as prize winning tickets will share equally in the prize pool available to winners in the respective Spot; and

14.1.3 any player who claims to be entitled to a prize must lodge a claim with ACTTAB.

14.2 In the case of prizes (including Keno Coin Toss) other than Spots 8 , 9 and 10 prizes:

14.2.1 prize money will be paid as soon as practicable after the draw either at ACTTAB Head Office or through any ACTTAB selling point terminal for tickets purchased from ACTTAB, on presentation of the ticket or record of electronic entry for evaluation by a selling point terminal, subject to these Rules.

14.2.2 Any player who claims to be entitled to a prize but:

- Whose entry has not been identified by the central computer system as a prize winning entry;
- Claims that their entry has been incorrectly evaluated by ACTTAB or SALC; or
- Has not obtained confirmation that their ticket has won a prize, after its evaluation by a selling point terminal,

must lodge a claim with ACTTAB.

14.3 A claim under Rule 14.1 and 14.2:

- may be lodged with ACTTAB either personally or by registered mail;
- must reach ACTTAB within the claim period;
- must be accompanied by the ticket or record of electronic entry in respect of which the claim is made, clearly endorsed with the claimant's full name and address and/or proof of purchase; and
- if posted, must be accompanied by a self-addressed envelope bearing the correct postage.

#### 14.4 ACTTAB:

- will not be obliged to recognise any claim not identified as a prize winning entry by the central computer system within 12 months of the relevant day;
- may in its absolute discretion accept or refuse to accept a claim in whole or in part.

14.5 ACTTAB will keep the results of each draw for a period of 12 months from the relevant day and make the results available for perusal at any time during that period.

### 15. Internet Transactions

---

#### 15.1 Computer System Shutdown

- Customers should note that Keno investments cannot be placed after the ACTTAB Racing computer is shut down, usually around 11pm daily with the exception of Sunday which usually shuts down around 9pm. Any investments covering draws after the computer system has been shut down will be processed in later draws that night and if necessary upon resumption of draws the following morning. Any winnings will be credited to your account when all draws covered by any investments are completed and the ACTTAB Racing system is up.

#### 15.2 Acceptance of Internet Investments

- Internet Investments may only be made by use of a Betting Account against a credit balance.
- For every Internet Investment session, a customer will need to log on by providing the Betting Account number and selected code (PIN).
- A customer shall satisfy himself or herself that all the details recorded on the Internet Betting Confirmation screen are correct.
- The Investment is not sent to ACTTAB until it is confirmed by the customer on the Internet Betting Confirmation Screen by clicking "Submit Bet".
- Upon confirmation of the Investment by the customer, the customer may only cancel, amend or replace the Investment on terms determined by ACTTAB from time to time.
- The Investment submitted by the customer shall be accepted and confirmed by ACTTAB upon allocation by the ACTTAB of an Internet Betting Receipt.

#### 15.3 Internet Betting General Rules

- The customer is responsible for ensuring that the customer's Betting Account number and selected code (PIN) are kept secret.

- The customer is responsible for transactions relating to his or her Betting Account. Except for the circumstances outlined in these Rules, ACTTAB accepts no responsibility for disputed transactions or for transactions made by the Investor on his or her Betting Account.
  - The records of ACTTAB shall be conclusive evidence of and be deemed to be the true and correct record of all Internet Investments.
  - ACTTAB may cease to provide access to an customer to the internet site of ACTTAB to make Internet Investments at any time. This may be done without notice to the customer.
  - The customer warrants that all information provided by him or her on the Internet site of ACTTAB shall be true and correct and that he or she will immediately notify ACTTAB of any change to the information.
  - The customer agrees to the use by ACTTAB of the information provided by the customer on the internet site for any purpose relating to the opening of a Betting Account, the activation of Internet access, the making internet investments, for marketing purposes (subject to any privacy requirements) or as required by the law.
  - ACTTAB may change the information or the format of the information on the internet site of ACTTAB at any time without notice to the customer.
  - By making an Investment via any means of communication provided by ACTTAB, the customer warrants that he or she is 18 years of age or over and that making of the Investment does not violate any International, Federal, State or local laws.
